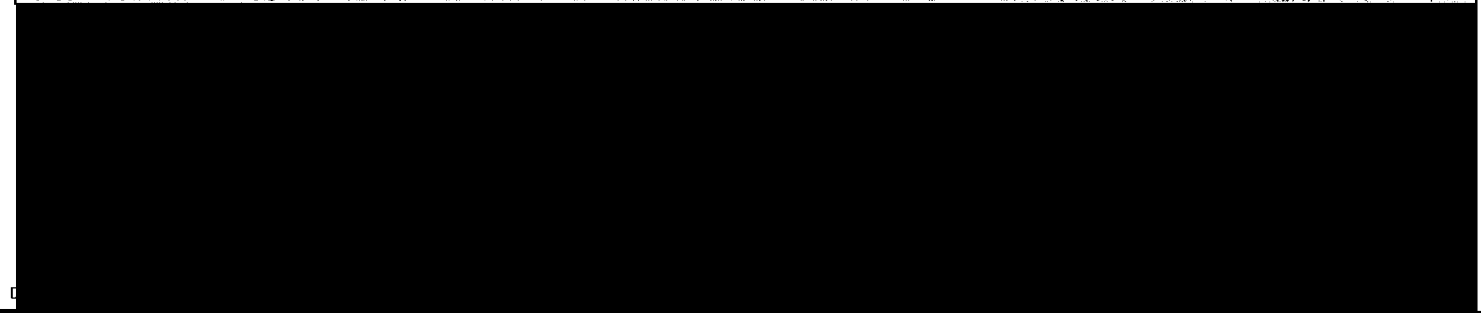

Narrative:

On August 25, 2011, at approximately 0400 hours, I arrived at Lake Claire building 57, room 311, for a medical response for a female who was not breathing. I arrived in the room and saw a white female, later identified as Ann Hefferin, laying on the floor of bedroom 311 with Officer Stewart leaning over her. Officer Stewart was setting up to give rescue breaths so I took a position for chest compressions. I noticed her eyes were open but not responsive and her lips had a blue tint. There were no visible signs of trauma, bleeding or vomit related asphyxiation. I was unable to locate a pulse and began chest compressions. During CPR, Ms. Hefferin took several reflexive but sporadic breaths but I was still unable to locate a pulse and she did not maintain breathing. Officer Stewart and I continued for five rounds of CPR before Orange County Fire Rescue and Seminole County Fire Rescue engine 65 arrived on scene at approximately 0405 hours and took over medical care. Lt. Thomas Sawyer was on scene for Orange County Fire Rescue and Lt. Corn was on scene for Seminole County Fire Rescue. While rescue was working on Ms. Hefferin, I checked her room for identification. [REDACTED] I was able to locate a Florida Driver's License in a small purse which was hanging from her bed post. I provided rescue with the license and the information about the medication. Rescue transported Ms. Hefferin to Florida Hospital East at approximately 0424 hours. Officer Stewart went to Florida Hospital East behind rescue. I spoke with [REDACTED] one of Ms. Hefferin's roommates, after Ms. Hefferin was transported to Florida Hospital East. [REDACTED] told me Ms. Hefferin was a new member of Delta Delta Delta and went out to a Sigma Chi party with another new Delta Delta Delta member, [REDACTED] earlier in the evening. She said Ms. Hefferin told her the group was planning to go to Deko nightclub after the party but that she wasn't planning on going with them. Ms. Hefferin was dropped off at her apartment by [REDACTED] at approximately 2345 hours. [REDACTED] She said Ms. Hefferin ate and went to bed at approximately 0015 hours. Approximately three hours later, Ms. Hefferin woke her up by pounding on her door. She told [REDACTED] she was having chest pain, dizziness, nausea, and problems seeing. [REDACTED] said she helped her to the bathroom where she threw up twice. She drank some water and laid back down then shortly after, Ms. Hefferin became unresponsive. [REDACTED] said she followed the directions provided over the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] completed a written, sworn statement. I offered the Victim's Advocate service and [REDACTED] refused. I provided her with the Victim's Rights pamphlet. I spoke with the other occupants of the apartment, which included two roommates, [REDACTED] a friend of a roommate, [REDACTED] said they heard Ms. Hefferin come home and could tell she had been drinking. [REDACTED] They also said she was able to walk around without difficulty while she was eating. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] completed written, sworn statements. I offered the Victim's Advocate service and they each refused. I provided them with the Victim's Rights pamphlet. I met with the resident assistant who held the apartment door open for me when I arrived, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] hours. At approximately 0300 - 0315, Ms. Hefferin knocked on her and told her she couldn't see, her heart hurt and she needed help. [REDACTED] that she helped Ms. Hefferin crawl to the bathroom to throw up. After Ms. Hefferin threw up, [REDACTED] gave

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her some water. Ms. Hefferin became unresponsive shortly after and started to turn blue. [REDACTED] called her sister who told her to call 911. He completed a written, sworn statement. Sgt. Gavette was on scene and organized notifications, see supplement. Officer Stewart completed a supplement. Officer Stephens responded to the scene and took digital pictures of the room and submitted them to evidence. Detective Freeman went to the Sigma Chi house to make contact with the house director, [REDACTED] and collected a written statement, see supplement. Officer Casebolt collected the shirt which was removed from Ms. Hefferin during CPR and submitted it into evidence. Lt. Emert responded to the scene and had it secured. The scene was turned over to Detective Chronister.

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
