On 10/29/2020, at approximately 0234, I conducted a traffic stop just east of Libra Dr on Gemini Blvd, Orlando Fl 32816, referencing a dark-colored Nissan sedan which Ofc. J. Hopkins had witnessed driving carelessly. See Ofc. J. Hopkins supplement for further details. The vehicle was bearing Fl tag PWDT18.

I made contact with the driver, identified by his Fl identification card as Antwan Malik Collier, I explained the reason for the traffic stop, and asked for proper documentation at which time Collier provided his identification card and stated he was working on getting his license.

I asked Collier, if there was anything in the vehicle I need to know about, at which time Collier stated possessed a firearm underneath his seat. Collier attempted to reach for the weapon to show its location, I instructed Collier to leave the firearm in its location until I retrieve it.

Ofc. Hopkins and I conducted a search of the vehicle referencing the odor of cannabis emanating from the vehicle, with negative results. I retrieved the firearm located underneath Collier's seat, which was within his immediate reach. The firearm was unsecured and loaded with a live round in the chamber.

The weapon is a FN handgun SN # 386383825. The University of Central Florida Communication division conducted a FCIC/NCIC check on the weapon with negative results.

Collier stated he possessed a concealed firearms license. I requested the University of Central Florida Communication division to conducted a check for his concealed firearms license at which time they stated he did not possess one.

I read Collier his Miranda rights from an agency provided card, which he waived. Collier stated he knew he could not operate a motor vehicle with an identification card only. Collier also stated he did not have a valid driver's license.

I placed Collier under arrest for 790.01(2) CARRYING A CONCEALED FIREARM and 322.34(2) DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED (DWLS). I issued Collier a citation for operating a vehicle driver's license suspended, citation # AD22MBE.

I transported Collier to Orange County Jail without incident.

With permission of Collier the vehicle was released to Brandon Moore.

The interaction was captured on my Axon body-worn camera and uploaded to evidence.com.

A SAR was completed for Collier.

Narrative:

On 10/29/2020, at approximately 0232 hours, I was exiting Zone 4 (Pointe at Central Apartments, 2635 College Knight Trl.), attempting to return to main campus. As I attempted to make a U-turn, going from southbound Alafaya Trl. to northbound Alafaya Trl., I observed two vehicles that appeared to be racing. Both vehicles were traveling at what appeared to be a very dangerous speed, no less than 75mph in a 45mph zone. I made a U-turn and attempted to catch up to the vehicles. As we continued down Alafaya Trl., northbound, I observed one of the vehicles, a gray sedan, run the red light at Alafaya Trl. & Research Pkwy., nearly striking a vehicle that was stopped at the red light. I was not able to get close enough to read the license plate. As they approached University Blyd., the vehicle made a right turn, turning onto campus.

Due to the concern for public safety, I notified dispatch with all information and Cpl. Lopez stated he was able to see the vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed down Gemini Blvd., towards Ursa Minor St. Ofc. Rojas then stated he was at the intersection of Gemini Blvd. and Libra Dr. Ofc. Rojas stated he saw the vehicle on Gemini Blvd., approaching Libra Dr. Ofc. Rojas got behind the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. Please see Cpl. Lopez and Ofc. Rojas's reports for their involvement in the case.

Ofc. Rojas gathered all the information needed and advised he could smell the odor of cannabis emanating from the vehicle, which I also smelled. All 4 occupants of the vehicle were asked to exit the vehicle in order to conduct a search. While searching, I found a backpack in the passenger side floorboard. Inside of the backpack I found a loaded AR 15 Semi-Automatic rifle (Ser. BMSV254) with a magazine inserted. I also found a Glock pistol (Ser. 20078212) with an extended magazine inside of the backpack. There were also loose ammunition rounds and extra parts for the weapons inside of the vehicle. The serial numbers for two firearms were provided to dispatch, who advised negative results per FCIC/NCIC. The passenger whose side the backpack was found on had a valid CCW and the firearms were placed back inside of the backpack and placed in the trunk of the vehicle.

Ofc. Rojas found a firearm under the driver's seat, who did not possess a CCW and placed the driver under arrest. Please see Ofc. Rojas's report for further information regarding his arrest and individuals involved. The firearm recovered was a black FNH Semi-Automatic pistol with a 20 round loaded magazine (Ser. 386383825). I placed the firearm and magazine into evidence and completed a evidence form.

### Marrative

On 10/29/2020, at approximately 0230 hours, I was conducting an area check of Millican Hall (4365 Andromeda Loop N, Orlando, FL, 32816), when I heard Ofc. Hopkins calling out a reckless driver (dark-colored sedan) doing approximately 80-90 mph and running red traffic lights on Alafaya Trail N. I asked Ofc. Hopkins for clarification in reference to the location of the vehicle and he said the vehicle was approaching campus and turned into University Boulevard towards UCF main campus. Ofc. Hopkins later advised there was a second vehicle involved but it made a right turn into Research Parkway. I observed a vehicle matching the description provided by Ofc. Hopkins traveling at a high rate of speed going eastbound on Gemini Blvd South towards Central Florida Boulevard. As I was providing the details to the UCF Police Department Communications Division, Ofc. Rojas advised he was at the intersection of Gemini Boulevard East and Libra Drive. Ofc. Rojas spotted the vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed and conducted a traffic stop for such violation. I arrived at the scene along with Ofc. Hopkins to assist Ofc. Rojas. Once I approached the vehicle, I observed there were four occupants including the driver. I heard Ofc. Rojas asked the driver if there was anything inside the vehicle and I heard the driver said there was a "gun" inside. Both Ofc. Rojas and Ofc. Hopkins asked all the occupants to step out so they could conduct a search since the odor of marijuana was also emanating from the interior of the vehicle. While conducting the vehicle search, another vehicle parked behind Cpl. Imparato's patrol vehicle and approximately six individuals started the approached scene. Cpl. Imparato took charge of them while I was assisting Ofc. Rojas and Ofc. Hopkins. See Cpl. Imparato's supplement report for further details about his interactions with the individuals.

While Ofc. Rojas and Ofc. Hopkins were searching the vehicle, three firearms were located inside the vehicle. One firearm was under the driver's seat within arms reach and the other two were inside a black back pack belonging to the front seat passenger who was later identified as Eric Mitchell, DOB: 10/08/1997. All firearms were checked through FCIC/NCIC with negative results. Eric Mitchell had a valid Concealed Weapons Permit and it was verified by the UCF Police Department Communications Division. The driver, who was later identified as Antwan Collier claimed multiple times to poses a Concealed Weapons Permit. However, he was unable to provide the permit and the UCF Police Department Communications Division verified he did not poses a Concealed Weapons Permit. As a result, Ofc. Rojas placed Collier under arrest for Possession of a Concealed Weapon and Driving With a Suspended License.

After Collier got arrested, his friends and the other occupants of the other vehicle got upset and began yelling profanity towards Ofc. Wilk. See Ofc. Wilk's supplement report for further information.

Cpl. Imparato contacted the on-call Watch Commander and kept him informed about the situation.

I instructed all of the officers working under my squad to complete supplement reports referencing their interactions. All video footage from all of the officers involved body-worn cameras were safely uploaded into evidence.com.

There is not additional information at this time.

Narrative

On 10/29/2020, at 0258 hours, I responded to assist officers who were on a traffic stop at the intersection of Libra Drive and Gemini Blvd. The stop was conducted by Ofc. Rojas and was on a four door Nissan. Corporal Imparato informed me there were some bystanders in a Mercedes who were trying to interfere with the traffic stop and investigation. Cpl. Imparato told me the vehicle turned into the C3 parking lot. I then observed five males come from the parking lot and began walking northbound on the sidewalk, parallel to the traffic stop.

I approached them and asked them to please not walk any further on the sidewalk for their safety. One of the males stated he knew his rights. I explained to them, the officers were conducting an investigation, and for their own safety, until the investigation is complete, not to walk any further. The subjects kept asking me questions about the traffic stop. I explained to them, multiple times I was not working the traffic stop and my purpose was to make sure they did not interfere with the other officers.

The individuals told me the subjects who the officers were out with were their friends. They kept trying to talk to the them by yelling across the street and at the stop. I explained to them, again, to not interfere with the investigation, however, they kept yelling at the subjects who were detained. I explained if they kept interfering, I was going to trespass them. Two of the subjects began to get irate and began yelling various derogatory comments. They continued to ask me questions about the investigation and again, I explained I was not part of the stop.

They then noticed one of their friends from the traffic stop (Antwan Collier) was in handcuffs and being placed under arrest. The subjects got extremely angry and started yelling profanity toward the officers involved in the stop. The subjects began yelling the following at the officers;

- "Pigs"
- "Eat a fucking donut"
- "Dumb as hell"
- "Stupid ass"
- "I bet they'll try to put some coke in there. You know how these pigs do"
- "Bitch"
- "Fucken pigs"
- "Fuck them"
- "Stupid"
- "He plays football for ya'll, fuck"
- "This is dumb ass shit. Ya'll ain't got no life"
- "Instead of sucking a dick you want to come out here and fuck with somebody"
- "Fuck you pigs"

Once the scene was cleared, the males walked back to the C3 parking lot and left the area.

### Narrative

On 10/29/2020 at approximately 0232 hours, Officer Hopkins relayed to UCF units he observed a vehicle, described as a black four door sedan, travelling north on Alafaya Trail at a high rate of speed. Ofc. Hopkins stated the vehicle failed to stop at numerous red lights on Alafaya Trail. He maintained a visual of the vehicle as it turned west onto University Blvd.

Officer Rojas stated he was stationary outside of the Recreation and Wellness Center (12800 Gemini Blvd South) waiting for the vehicle to pass him. Officer Rojas observed a gray Nissan pass his location at a high rate of speed. He got behind the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. Corporal Lopez and Officer Hopkins responded to assist him.

A few minutes later, I passed by the scene of the stop and observed Officers trying to conduct a vehicle search as well as maintain scene security. I stopped by to offer my assistance to Cpl. Lopez and advised I would provide overwatch of the passengers.

I contacted Antwan Collier, Brandon Moore, Aaron Robinson, and Eric Mitchell. The subjects questioned why they were being stopped and why there was so many police units "making a scene". I relayed the information I had at the time to them. During the stop, I was informed via the radio, units who were searching the vehicle recovered "numerous" weapons. Mitchell told me he had a concealed weapon permit and had already informed the other officers they had firearms in the car. I asked Mitchell what kind of weapons were in the car and he replied he had a "Glock 19 and an AR15".

While I was providing scene security and overwatch of the subjects, a second vehicle, a grey Mercedes (Fl tag HDNT53) arrived on scene and pulled behind my patrol vehicle. Two subjects exited the vehicle, one of whom I identified by DAVID as Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste (05-31-2001) and began walking toward the scene. My attention was diverted to the subjects who identified themselves as UCF football players. The subjects were standing in the northbound lanes of Gemini Blvd and continued to approach the stop. I ordered the subjects to get back in their vehicle and to leave the scene. I told the subjects if they wished to wait for their friends they could do so across the street in the C3 parking lot, or at the intersection of Libra Dr and Gemini Blvd. Jean-Baptiste became argumentative and refused to comply with my lawful order. Jean-Baptiste questioned why he had to leave and I informed him at that time my attention was on them and not on the call and they were interfering with an investigation. I also advised if they didn't leave the scene they would be placed under arrest for resisting an officer. Jean-Baptiste and the other unidentified male got back in the car and pulled away.

I continued to converse with the four subjects who were detained as part of the traffic stop. Those subjects all identified themselves as UCF football players. A few moments later, I observed five subjects exit the C3 parking lot and begin walking northbound on Gemini Blvd on the north side of the road. I motioned for those subjects not to come any closer to the scene and to stay on that side of the roadway. Jean-Baptiste, yelled in my direction that he knew the law and could do what he wanted. Officer Wilk arrived on scene and I directed her to stay on the north side of the road with the subjects who wanted to witness the stop.

A short time later, Collier was directed to speak with Officers Hopkins and Rojas. Collier spoke with them and was subsequently placed under arrest. Seeing this, the other subjects became upset and emotional. Moore, Robinson, and Mitchell began to question why Collier was being arrested. I told them I did not know, however, as a courtesy I would try and gather as much information as I could. Mitchell then asked to speak with a supervisor, and I relayed to him, that I was the supervisor and would be happy to answer any questions they had.

I conferred with Officer Hopkins and Rojas who relayed to me they discovered a firearm under the driver's seat and in immediate reach of Collier. Corporal Lopez confirmed dispatch had checked FCIC/NCIC for CCW permits which yielded a negative result for Collier. I was also informed Collier had admitted to possessing the concealed weapon and knowingly did so without possessing a permit.

I relayed this information to Moore, Robinson, and Mitchell and urged them to maintain their composure and to keep a level head. Mitchell asked why he couldn't just claim the gun was his to save Collier from being arrested. I relayed the information I had to Moore, Robinson, and Mitchell and although they appeared upset, all stated they understood our actions due to the seriousness of the offense.

I then contacted the on-call watch commander, Major Freeman, and briefed him on the incident.

I then contacted Officer Wilk and the other subjects on the north side of the road. As a courtesy, I told them what was happening and attempted to offer guidance on the next steps. Jean-Baptiste immediately became hostile and argumentative, yelling "that's the bitchest shit I ever heard bruh" he continued screaming "Instead of letting a black person live his life, he aint got nothing on his record. That mans my blood, you act like he's a bad person. He plays football for you all." He continued screaming, "you got no life. You want to come out here and fuck with somebody. These niggers will fuck your life. Instead of letting him play a game you want to take him to jail. Fuck shit" the other subjects who were on scene (unidentified) began screaming "fucking pigs!" numerous times as well as and "fuck off UCF". Those subjects eventually left the scene.

After they left, I direct all remaining units to clear the scene. I followed up with Major Freeman and briefed him via text of the outcome of the investigation as well as the actions of the other subjects on scene.

I reviewed the Milestone Camera system and noted the following videos;
